



## **Winter Razzle Meet Info &** **Covid-19 Preparedness Plan**

Thank you for your patience through this challenging time. We have designed this information to help you get ready for the 1st MN meet since the pandemic began. We are working hard to make sure our meet is a great experience for everyone!

**AAI Meet Equipment:** 2 Sets of each event (including 2 full floors)

### **Coaches Expectations & Guidance:**

- Coaches will report 15 minutes before stretch for session preparation.
- Coaches must wear a mask at all times (no exceptions).
- Coaches will report to the scores table for check-in & to receive a coaches' packet
- Coaches will turn in scratches to the scoring table.
- Coaches will give 1 wristband per gymnast for their spectator PRIOR to attending the meet.
- A coaches' meeting will take place at the scoring table 5 minutes into the open stretch time.
- Coaches will turn in event line-ups for EVERY EVENT before march-in.
- Coaches will turn in floor music/music type to the music table PRIOR to march-in.
- Coaches will time their own bar & beam warm-ups.
- Coaches are limited to 2 coaches per team unless you're split into more than 1 rotation.
- Open stretch will only be 15 minutes per session and will be at their first event.  
(Additional Floor space may be available for some sessions)
- Coaches are responsible for their gymnasts during the meet. Coaches and athletes are expected to follow 6ft social distancing guidelines.
- Coaches will pick up their gymnasts' medals at the end of each session from the awards table. (We will not mail awards that are not picked up).
- Coaches are asked not to approach the judges for any reason. If you have questions, please direct them to the Meet Ref or Meet Director.
- Legacy is providing water, pop, and packaged snacks for coaches. Please be prepared to bring your own food or have it delivered.
- Please share Gymnast and Spectator expectations with your gymnasts and their families BEFORE attending the meet.

## Winter Razzle Awards:

We will have a quick awards ceremony after each session.

The gymnasts will report to the B-Side equipment area.

- A-side Gymnasts will report to the designated B-side Awards area.
- B-Side Gymnasts will stay at their last event within the B-side area.

Awards announcers will announce the event placements.

The gymnast will stand up to be recognized and stay standing up.

Once we have called all the placements, they will all sit back down.

We will call team awards the same way.

Coaches will pick up medals and banners at the end of the session to bring back to their gyms to distribute. (If for some reason a session runs behind we may only announce team awards but all medals and banners will still need to be picked up).

## Gymnast Expectations

- Gymnasts may arrive 10 minutes before stretch.
- Gymnasts must wear masks at all times, other than when they are actively on the equipment.
- Gymnasts must perform proper social distancing throughout the meet.
- Gymnasts should go to the right once they enter the State Fair Coliseum to report to the arena entrance for gymnast check-in.
- Only Gymnasts in the current meet session are allowed in the competition area.
- Gymnasts are asked to bring their own hand sanitizer and asked to sanitize their hands before/after each event as well as if they sneeze or wipe their face.
- Gymnast's are asked to wear slippers or flip flops on the concrete floor.
- **GYMNAST CHALK PROTOCOL**  
Per USAG & MN USAG on chalk guidance, The meet hosts will not supply chalk. Teams are required to bring their own chalk & chalk containers either for each individual use or "pod/group" use. Coaches will be in charge of their own chalk-up stations. We will have tables off to the side for chalking stations but gymnasts will need to follow proper social distancing guidance.

## Spectator Expectations

- Spectators must wear masks at all times.
- Spectators will be allowed in only 10 minutes before open stretch for each session.
- Only 1 spectator per gymnast is allowed.
- The spectator must enter with the wristband that was provided by their coach before attending the meet.
- Spectators must stay 6ft apart in the stands.
- Spectators must enter and exit through the designated areas.
- Spectators are not allowed on the competition floor.
- Spectators only at the main gate of the State Fair entrance will be open!
